













40% of businesses rated the local business climate as good or excellent.






Is there enough business creation in your community?















Question, "What is the intended time-frame?"




16% of businesses surveyed (125 of 795) have a pending ownership change






How many businesses have a current business plan?

Question, "Is there a formal succession plan?"








How many businesses plan to expand within three years?
